### ED-1100 Educational Foundations, 3 credit hours

#### **Course Description**

This course is designed to challenge you, the student, to think about ministry from an educational perspective, to provide an introduction to educational theory and practice with specific attention given to a study of the teaching-learning process and lesson design. You will gain skills necessary in preparing lesson plans for use in teaching the Bible.

There are no prerequisites for this course. However, it is recommended that you will have completed BI-1120 Elements of Bible Study. You will create lesson plans based on assignments completed in Elements of Bible Study.

#### **Course Goals**

In this course, you will:

- Learn the historical, philosophical, theological and biblical foundations of Christian education
- Understand how to utilize Bible Study Methods to create lesson plans for teaching
- Learn how to create lesson plans from papers written in Elements of Bible Study
- Learn how to teach developed lesson plans

#### **Course Objectives**

After completing this course, you should be able to:

- 1. Recall and recognize the historical, philosophical, theological and biblical foundations of Christian Education
- 2. Demonstrate understanding of analysis and systemization of Bible study methods
- 3. Develop lesson plans from Elements of Bible Study papers
- 4. Teach two Bible lessons developed from Elements of Bible Study papers

### Course Textbook(s) and/or Supplemental Information

## **Assignments**

All assignments (reading and written) are due as indicated on the Course Schedule. To successfully complete this course, you need to:

- READING: Read the textbooks and supplementary materials. There are approximately 440 pages
  of reading. The completion of the course reading is an important part of the course. You are
  expected to complete the reading prior to participating in discussion forums, and will be required
  to submit a reading report at the end of each week when reading is assigned.
- 2. **DISCUSSION BOARDS:** Post two substantive online posts per week answering questions in the class schedule.
- NEEDS ASSESSMENT: Submit the CBT Student Needs Assessment for Lesson 1 during Week 3.
   Forms are in the Week 3 Assignments >> Lessons 3 & 4 Resources folder within the Assignments section of Blackboard.
- 4. **EXEGETICAL AND PEDAGOGICAL IDEAS PAPERS:** Develop two single page papers based upon Table 10 Exegetical and Pedagogical Ideas demonstrated in Creative Bible Teaching, page 134. Submit the papers to the Assignment Manager links in the **Week 3 Assignments** folder for Lesson 1 and **Week 6 Assignments** folder for Lesson 2.
- Lesson Plan Development: Develop two lesson plans based on work completed in Elements
  of Bible Study. Use the Lesson Plan Worksheet located in the course.
  - a. The first lesson plan must be on Jonah or John 13:1-17. (If you have not taken Elements of Bible Study, you will need to complete two inductive Bible studies. Instructions for Inductive Bible Study are in the Class Schedule- Week 2.
  - b. The second lesson plan can be on Jonah, John 13:1-17, Psalm 42, Acts 8:4-25, Ephesians 2:11-3:13 or Galatians 5;1-12 (studies completed in Elements of Bible Study). You may also choose, Genesis 22:1-19, Exodus 4, Joshua 7, Judges 16, or 1 Samuel 17
- 6. **LESSON PLAN TEACHING:** Schedule a time to teach both lessons.
- 7. **STAKES EVALUATION MODEL:** Submit a Stakes Evaluation Model to the Assignment Manager links for Lessons 1 & 2.
- 8. CLASS PARTICIPATION: Attendance is also expected. You must maintain a significant presence in the discussion board. Please refer to the discussion board grading guide included in the *Course Resources* section of this course for more information on how your participation in the discussion boards will be assessed.
- 9. FINAL EXAM: Complete the Final Examination.
