COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Information

ED-3342, Teaching and Ministry Skills for Children and Family Ministry, 3 credit hours

Course Description

This course begins with a brief investigation of teaching methods from a theologically informed Christian worldview. Relevant ministry topics such as worship, Bible study, and faith development for the child and family will be discussed. Teaching paradigms and skills with creative elements such as object lessons, drama, storytelling, and technology will be investigated, modeled, and then practiced by students. Ministry skills needed to lead and ensure a safe, effective ministry to children will be taught. Field experience and ministry observations are a part of this course's hands-on learning. Students are encouraged to take Foundations for Children and Family Ministry prior to enrollment in this course.

Prerequisites: None.

Course Objectives

By the completion of this course you should be able to:

- 1. Students will be able to demonstrate a developmentally appropriate and theologically discerning rationale for children's ministries that will guide pedagogical aims and methods
- 2. Students will be able to demonstrate skills in creative methods as object lessons, drama, games, and media by learning what the different methods are and then practicing them within the class and in ministry situations.
- 3. Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of basic ministry and leadership skills.

 response to the discussion question by mid-week (Friday, 11:59pm Central Time (CT)). Then
 read all other threads and respond to at least two (2) other student initial threads by the end of
 the week (Monday, 11:59pm CT).
- 3. **Quiz:** Throughout this course there will be a closed book, closed note quiz over assigned material on Puritans, Pilgram's Progress, and John Bunyan.

B. ASSIGNMENTS: Assignments are the primary means of assessing whether learning has transpired and may include papers, reports, exams, projects, and the like. Assignments are submitted through a link in Blackboard so they can be recorded in the Blackboard Grade Center. Your instructor will grade your assignments and return them through the Grade Center.
