#### **Course Number, Name, and Credit Hours**

MS1103 Christian Missions, 3 credits

#### **Course Description**

A study of the church fulfilling its missionary function in the world. Particular attention is given to the nature of the church of Jesus Christ and its biblical basis for missions, the church's cross-cultural mission, the historical dynamic of its mission today, and the role of the local church in world evangelization.

#### **Course Goals**

In this course you will:

- Understand that God has a mission and that the Bible is a missional book
- Understand the major events and people of missions history
- Understand the role of culture in global disciplemaking
- Understand the responsibility of you and your local church in global disciplemaking
- Understand current trends and practices in contemporary missions

#### **Course Objectives**

After completing this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Identify from the Bible the development of the theme of World Missions as God's plan for the ages, giving critical concern to relevant theological issues affecting missionary concerns
- 2. Summarize the major expansion routes of Christianity from the Apostolic Period to the present, giving special attention to the key ingredients of church growth and expansion
- 3. Identify and explain the distinctive cultural dimensions of missions work at home and abroad
- 4. Describe the major contemporary issues uniquely shaping the mission for the church today
- 5. Summarize the roles and responsibilities of individual Christians and the local church in obedience to the biblical mandate of global disciplemaking
