COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Information

SF4402 Communities and Spiritual Formation, 3 credit hours

Course Description

An evaluation of relationship between individual formation and one's own social setting. Emphasis placed on the investigation of structural evil and power relations and how they impact the formation of individuals. Individual responsibility for impacting their context is also addressed.

Prerequisites: TH-4402 The Church and Salvation; can be taken concurrently.

Course Objectives

By the completion of this course you should be able to:

- 1. Describe the interrelationship between community and individual in spiritual formation
- 2. Analyze spiritually formative practices in relation to modern-day culture
- 3. Evaluate community practices and dynamics and their impact on spiritual formation
- 4. Create plans for fostering corporate and individual spiritual formation

If not specified, **post your initial**



response to the discussion question by mid-week (Friday, 11:59pm Central Time (CT)). Then read all other threads and **respond to at least two (2)** other student initial threads by the end of the week (Monday, 11:59pm CT).

B. ASSIGNMENTS: Assignments are the primary means of assessing whether learning has transpired and may include papers, reports, exams, projects, and the like. Assignments are submitted through a link in Blackboard so they can be recorded in the Blackboard Grade Center. Your instructor will grade your assignments and return them through the Grade Center.
