

You may audition on-campus or upload audio/video recordings online (see page 2). Applicants are evaluated on their ability to meet the requirements listed below. You may audition for multiple emphases/applied areas, but only one is required. While the repertoire categories are the same for both the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Music degree programs, more challenging selections and an elevated performance level will be expected for admission into the Bachelor of Music (for degree program descriptions, visit <a href="https://www.moody.edu/music/programs">www.moody.edu/music/programs</a>).

Emphasis or Applied Area	Audition Requirements		
Composition	A student should present a portfolio of 2-5 original, creative works (hand or computer notated manuscripts and an audio CD recording) demonstrating a variety of instrumentation and/or vocal forces, and prepare the following pieces on piano, one of which should be memorized:  1. A Bach two-part invention or sinfonia, or fugue from the Well-Tempered Clavier 2. An allegro movement from any Haydn, Mozart, or Beethoven sonata; or a Romantic or Modern era piece		
Ethno- musicology	A primary applied area (e.g., organ, violin, voice, etc.) must be chosen, and audition requirements should be fulfilled in that area (see applied areas below). Students who choose an applied area other than piano should also prepare the following on piano:  1. One piano work on the difficulty level of Bach two-part invention, simple Chopin prelude, or fast movement of a Clementi sonatina  2. One four-part hymn		
Instrument	A student must show proficiency in his or her chosen field and should be prepared to:

Organ	<ol> <li>A student auditioning on piano should prepare the following:         <ol> <li>A two- or three-part polyphonic Baroque piece</li> <li>The first movement of a Classical sonata or a Romantic or Modern era piece</li> <li>A hymn for congregational accompaniment</li> </ol> </li> <li>A student auditioning on organ should prepare the following:         <ol> <li>One of the Eight Little Preludes and Fugues by Bach</li> <li>A small, expressive work by a compose such as Purvis, Brahms or Mendelssohn</li> <li>A hymn for congregational accompaniment</li> </ol> </li> <li>The in-person audition (for both piano and organ) or time of initial enrollment will require a demonstration of sight-reading, scales, and improvisational skills.</li> </ol>		
Piano	<ol> <li>A Bach three-part sinfonia or fugue from the Well-Tempered Clavier</li> <li>An allegro movement from any Haydn, Mozart, or Beethoven sonata</li> </ol>		
	3. A Romantic or Modern Era piece The in-person audition or time of initial enrollment will require sight-reading a hymn for congregational accompaniment, scales, and a display of improvisational skills.		
Voice	From memory, with a piano accompanist (provided by us for on-campus auditions):  1. An art song (classical song arranged for solo voice)  2. A solo piece with Christian text (contemporary or traditional)  The natural quality of the voice (vibrato, clarity, resonance, etc.) and overall musicianship (pitch, rhythm, dynamics, etc.) will be considered.		



Submit this one week prior to an on-campus audition or along with a recorded audition.
